WESTOVER -- It's now easier for riders on the Grey Line to reach cities like Washington, D.C., Chicago and New York.

The bus will now make two trips a day to the Pittsburgh International Airport and the Greyhound bus station in Pittsburgh.

From there, riders can make connections to other destinations or connect with Pittsburgh's bus system for a quick trip into the city to catch a baseball game.

The new services will start July 1.

Mountain Line is also offering an incentive to get people to use its Park and Ride lot.

That incentive is \$20.

Mountain Line is offering to pay West Virginia University faculty, staff, and students \$5 a day to use its Park and Ride lot in Westover.

Downtown parking can cost up to \$65 a month or more and the bus service offers the paid-to-park program to cut down on traffic and save money.

Riders must sign up online, and after using the lot for five days, they will find \$20 in their Mountie Bountie accounts.

Riders can cash in for parking also starting July 1.
