

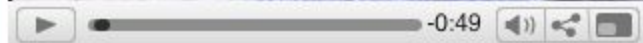


Mountainline Transit Authority Expands Pittsburgh Service

The Mountainline Transit Authority in Morgantown started offering more trips for riders going to Pittsburgh beginning today.

Mountainline will be offering two-a-day trips on their Grey Line to the Pittsburgh International Airport, as well as to the Pittsburgh Greyhound bus station.

They will also offer trips for employees at Mylan in Morgantown who commute from Marion or Harrison counties to work.

David Bruffy, general manager of Mountainline, says that the expanded bus services will offer a good alternative to people driving their own cars amidst rising gas prices.
